During Stockholm Furniture & Light Fair Wästberg introduces w161 Marfa, a table lamp developed in collaboration with Claesson Koivisto Rune.

For their architectural project, the inde / jacobs gallery building in Marfa Texas, Claesson Koivisto Rune designed and developed in collaboration with Wästberg, a task light for Mr Vilis Inde's gallery desk.

The small town of Marfa is best known as the home of artist Donald Judd and where he bought several buildings and turned them into permanent installations of minimalist art.

A lamp for an art gallery should do its job and not steal any attention. The w161 Marfa Lamp, a LED task light, is made out of one piece of anodized or lacquered aluminium, folded three times. When seen from the side, the lamp is merely a thin line.

Minimal expression. Maximum efficiency in material, production, light and energy consumption.

The lamp is as well available as a wall-mounted reading light.

## Wästberg

Wästberg launched its premier collection in 2008 and although this newcomer appears to have come out of nowhere – nothing could be further from the truth. Its founder, Magnus Wästberg, was born into the lighting trade and had through experience gained an understanding for the need to fuse aesthetic sensibility with Swedish engineering mentality.

Today Wästberg has a growing catalogue developed in close collaboration with some of the World's most renowned architects and designers. Including David Chipperfield, Claesson Koivisto Rune, Ilse Crawford, James Irvine, Jonas Lindvall, Jean-Marie Massaud, Nendo, Inga Sempé, Maarten Van Severen, Sam Hecht & Kim Colin and Dirk Winkel. Only with designers like them could Wästberg's ideas be turned into successful products.

The lamps have been honoured with more than 50 Awards and nominations for design excellence, including Good Design Awards, Reddot Awards, Design Award of the Federal Republic of Germany, Wallpaper\* Design Award, the Swedish Design Awards "Design S", "Guldägget", Elle Interiör Design Award, FORM +1 Award and London Design Museum's "Designs of the Year" Award.

## Claesson Koivisto Rune

The Swedish architects and designers Mårten Claesson, Eero Koivisto and Ola Rune opened their studio in Stockholm, in 1995. Commissions for the multi-award winning practice include the Inde/Jacobs gallery in Texas, Nobis Hotel and Hotel Skeppsholmen in Stockholm, Sfera Building in Kyoto, Tind prefab houses and a number of private houses in Sweden and abroad.

Their architectural work has been exhibited at the Venice Architecture Biennale. As designers they work with Arflex, Cappellini, Fontana Arte, Kasthall, Living Divani, Marsotto Edizioni, Offecct, Paola Lenti, Swedese and Tacchini among others. Their designs have won awards including Designer of the Year 2011 and 2014 by Elle Décor Italia, Red Dot "Best of the Best" 2014 and The Bruno Mathsson Prize 2015.
